3. The ACU

The Association of Commonwealth Universities (ACU) was established in 1913 and is the oldest inter-university network in the world, with over 500 members in six continents. It is a voluntary organisation, registered in England and Wales as a charity (number 314137), and is controlled by its member institutions through an elected Council. Her Majesty the Queen, the Head of the Commonwealth, is Patron of the ACU. The secretariat of the ACU is based in London, UK, with around 50 members of staff.

Universities UK is the major representative body and membership organisation for the UK higher education sector. It represents the UK's universities and some higher education colleges.
