

Application requirements for Postgraduate applicants from Namibia

Applicants interested in applying to join a postgraduate course at the University of Malta are required to satisfy the applicable entry requirements which may be found at: <http://www.um.edu.mt/courses/>

It is important to note that the International Admissions Office would only be able to determine an applicant's eligibility to join his/her preferred course, once an application is submitted along with the required documents. Applications for postgraduate courses are considered at the sole discretion of the respective Faculty / Institute / Centre once an application has been submitted together with the required documents.

All overseas candidates applying for a course at the University of Malta are required to present the following documents:

- Copy of their passport; and
- A detailed CV showing any qualifications and work experience gained after leaving secondary school; and
- Scanned copies of their Bachelor degree and detailed transcripts in the original language and certified English translated copies (where applicable) of these qualifications/ transcripts; and
- ***Since the language of tuition and communication is English, all applicants must be in possession of either:***
 - a) a pass at 5 or higher in English Language in Cambridge School Certificate (CSC); or a pass at Grade C or better in English Language in the Namibia Senior Secondary Certificate (Ordinary Level); or a Grade C or better in English Language in the Senior Certificate; or a Grade C or better in the Namibia Senior Secondary School Certificate (Ordinary Level); or***
 - b) a Secure English Language Test (TOEFL/IELTS/Cambridge Advanced) at the required grades and by the stipulated deadline. Kindly refer to this link for more information: www.um.edu.mt/international/international/english_language_requirements***
- Some courses may require applicants to submit a Research Proposal, a Portfolio of works, or other documentation. **Applicants to Masters by Research programmes are required to submit a research proposal with their application.**
- In some cases, especially when a course can only accept a limited number of students, applicants may be required to attend an interview or sit for some other kind of assessment.

Furthermore, Scholarship applicants are also required to submit the application form, and to present a letter of motivation and three letters of reference. These are to be submitted as signed and scanned copies to their respective University.

Other information

Applicants are to submit their applications to their home Universities by **Monday 27 May 2019**.

Universities in Namibia are to nominate **two** candidates to the University of Malta on international@um.edu.mt by the **Tuesday 4 June 2019**.

No late applications will be considered.

University contacts who require information about particular courses or who wish to receive information about the comparability of the qualifications are to communicate with the International Office by email on international@um.edu.mt

Applications that are shortlisted for will be required to pay a non-refundable Euro95 application fee to the University of Malta. Necessary information will be communicated to the applicants in due course.
